



Issue derived from
factors common
across scenarios
**Stakeholder
Decision**



- Common issue required
- Different decisions to be taken according to stakeholder
- Different strategies to choose from
- Choice

Context

As per figure above we wish to align the indicators generated from the community values with those generated by the SDSS.

When an issue e.g. water availability is identified as a factor that is common across all the scenarios, the decisions that will be taken regarding how best to manage this will require an analysis, using the SDSS, of a number of strategies e.g. cap water use, pipe water in etc. The consequences of implementing the strategies will be deliberated to assist with the choice.

It is therefore important that the indicator measures generated by the SDSS align with those that the stakeholders will use to make choices.

This requires us to identify the values that the stakeholders hold and the indicators that are sensitive to change, practical, useful and relevant (the Deliberation side of the figure). The SDSS information generated will have to be able to populate these indicators and introduce new indicators not previously identified by the community but that will inform the deliberation. This will require a process of translation of SDSS outputs into useful, relevant indicators.

Our job at the alignment workshop is therefore to:

- **Identify** the common factors emerging across the scenarios developed by Kate and the team and validated by Susan and Tim i.e. **the Issues**
- Identify the **stakeholders** involved and the **decisions** that they may have to make related to addressing the issue
- Identify the **values and associated indicators** that will be impacted by the decisions from the community set and the SDSS
- Align the community values and indicators with the SDSS and identify any extra SDSS ones.

We will therefore have the scenario validation workshop before the alignment one and do work to identify the common issues across the scenarios and pick a couple to start with.

The participants will be: EW – policy and tech people and CFW (Roxane and Jane) and CRF objective 1 and objective 2 team members – The alignment workshop will be held in May.
